Laredo operates under a Council-Manager form of government. The Mayor is elected at-large and serves a four-year term, while eight City Council Members are elected by district. The City Manager oversees daily operations.

ABOUT THE JOB

The Utilities Department's Engineering Division is responsible for planning, designing, and delivering critical water and wastewater infrastructure improvements for the City. The division oversees all utility capital projects from initial planning and design through construction and closeout.

Reporting to the Utilities Director, the Engineering Manager will oversee engineering staff and consultants; manage water and wastewater capital improvement projects; prepare and administer the division's operational and capital budgets; coordinate with City departments, developers, and regulatory agencies; and present project updates to City leadership and City Council. This position plays a key role in long-range infrastructure planning, CIP execution, and ensuring projects meet technical, regulatory, schedule, and budget requirements.
